We got a snow day on Sunday, December 14, whether we wanted it or not. In the event of adverse weather on a Sunday morning, here is our policy:

If Wayne County is in a Level 2 snow emergency at 7 am, we will be closed for the morning. We may also close if a storm is imminent and may affect worshipper's ability to safely drive home; this will be decided by the moderator and pastor, based on local weather reports.

If we are closed, members will be notified in the following ways: an email CHAT will be sent, notification will be posted on our social media channels (currently Facebook and Instagram), and our voice mail message will be changed to reflect our closing. If you are unsure, please call the church line; if the message is our normal greeting, we are open, if we are closed, that will be the temporary greeting.

Church Council Meeting Summary from December 9, 2025

- *Treasurer's Report is on file. A committee will oversee the church investments. Further discussion will take place at the next meeting.
- *Staff reports are on file. Rev. Schieber will attend the youth mentor retreat in January. Communion will be moved to January 11.
- *Parish health will conduct blood pressure readings on the 2nd Sunday of each month. Records will not be kept at the church.
- *Two new elders, Jackie G., and Katherine B. have accepted positions.
- *The Heartland Conference set a goal of 2500 disaster kits being made and sent out to various agencies for 2025. The conference reports that 2800 kits were processed. Christ Church was a major contributor.
- *Thank you to everyone who helped clean the sanctuary in November.
- *Cross installation has taken place but is not complete. The cross will be turned. New lights will be installed.
- *Church directory update – please contact the church office if there is a discrepancy in the information that is on site. You may also provide a photo. Email it to the office. In January there will be an opportunity to have your photo taken following worship.
- *Please recycle only paper in blue containers.
- *Joe has submitted a written resignation as janitor, effective May 31, or sooner if a replacement is found.

Bigs & Littles



Bundle up—Bigs & Littles is having a Snow Party!
