I have seen more than one traffic jam along this route. Then suddenly the cars and trucks move on through. Yesterday, Steve and I came home from Canton and noticed that almost all the cones were gone and the construction is complete (at least for now).

It was fifteen months ago that I was called out of retirement to begin as your Bridge Pastor. This time of construction has lasted longer than I expected but sometimes that is how it is with building projects. There have been a few traffic jams along the way but no major wrecks. (God has been with us!) Now it is time to move ahead. It is time for a new settled pastor to take over.

On October 5th, I will lead worship. This will be my last Sunday as your Bridge Pastor. The new pastor will arrive the next day. I will return to Trinity UCC in Wooster where I've been a member for some time. Chances are we may run into one another at the grocery or Healthpoint, but I will adhere to clergy ethics and intentionally stay away from Christ Church for a year or so.

This congregation has been so understanding and gracious to me. I know that you called me and needed me to serve with you, but I feel like God led you to me because I needed you.

I'm not sure you are aware of this, but before Rev. Chris Nichols came to you, the Living Water Association had called me to see if I would be willing to serve as your Bridge Pastor. At that time, I had just been released from the hospital after being death-threatening ill. I was still so weak, fatigued, and frail. I said, "Absolutely not!" I needed to get better. I knew that I was not strong enough to lead a church this big and active. Finally, I relented and said, "Let me rebuild my strength and if they still need a pastor in July call me again." Guess what, they called me again. I believe that God used Christ Church to bring me healing. You served me even more than I served you. For this I am eternally grateful.

# CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE September 2025

Church Council Meeting Summary from September 9, 2025

Minutes from the August meeting were approved and are on file.

Treasurer's report and staff reports are on file.

CCCNS has begun their year. Suggested help with expenses: a fundraiser, giving tree, special offering.

Fellowship Committee has a tentative schedule: 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday potluck will resume in October; Halloween party October 26; Home for the Holidays November 28, with punch and cookies served to the community; Daughter's Dinner March 7 with a theme "Living in Full Bloom."

The Salvation Army is requesting twin bedding and blankets. A bed build will take place, with delivery September 17 or 18.

The security cameras are in place. OPD will have access to videos. The public will not have access. The parking lot resurfacing is complete.

An audit was completed by Contax on the church financial records. "The account was reviewed, and no discrepancies were found."

An HR committee and a Pastor Relations committee were formed.

Pastor Schroer's last Sunday is October 5. Rev. Michael Howard from the association office will preside over the Liturgy for Release. Rev Schroer will not have contact with church members or participate in church events for one year. A celebration of her ministry will take place in fellowship hall on October 5 following worship.

The next council meeting will take place Tuesday, October 14, 7 pm.



#### **Christ UCC Stewardship Team**


As we turn from August to September, we have completed 2/3's of 2025. The most recent report to Council shows a positive current fund balance of \$19,645. Some of this balance may be attributed to a decrease in salary expenses as we haven't had a settled pastor. Overall giving is up \$3193 for the year compared to last year and benevolent giving has increased \$1679.

We will be starting our Annual Stewardship Campaign at the end of October and appreciate your continued devotion and support of the ministries of Christ UCC.



#### World Wide Communion Sunday October 5, 2025

On this day we join millions of Christians around the globe to celebrate World Communion Sunday. From Africa to Asia, from Europe to the Americas, from the islands of the Pacific to the deserts of the Middle East – the family of God gathers at one table: different languages, different cultures, different traditions, yet one loaf, one cup, one Savior.





October's special offering will support Friendship Meals: Each week Friendship Meals cooks 180-200 full meals. They are fully volunteer run, including cooks, purchasers, treasurer, servers and board members. They rent the basement kitchen of our church and serve dinner every Thursday (except the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month.) Their model has always been that they don't ask questions and allow deliveries to anyone picking up food.
