- *Mission and Outreach distributed the list of special offerings for 2026.

- *Administration – Council approved estimate from Denny's Dyna-Kleen for cleaning of carpet and upholstered pews in the sanctuary. Cleaning to take place during the week. The office workroom has been cleaned in preparation for additional remodeling and freshening up, thanks to Jason and Mollie.
- *Jason was hired as custodian to work with Joe through the end of January and then take over beginning February 1.
- *Revised weather policy was approved by council.
- *Reception for new members planned.
- *Lisa presented a proposal for creation of a Sensory Sanctuary in the current Chapel space. She is submitting a grant application for assistance in funding. Council approved.
