Friends:

First, I must say how pleased I am to be with the Orrville Church of Christ United Church of Christ as your new bridge pastor. I look forward to getting to know you in the ministry we will share over the next few months.

I try to know names, but one of the first ways that I know people in a church building is by where they sit. Do you have a favorite place to sit in the sanctuary? You know, your seat? We all do. I'm not completely sure I understand the psychology behind that, but I do it too. Even when I'm a visitor to churches, I almost always head for the same area in the room. I do it when I arrive at meetings. I'll admit it; I'm uncomfortable anywhere else. Must be some kind of primal, territorial thing. Or just a deeply held, unexplainable OCD-type habit.

If you have been with the church for a while, many years possibly, you might recall someone who sat in "your" seat before you did. When we try to identify each other, we might say, "You know, the one who sits on the left side, third row from the back, toward the window."

Maybe it's in our church DNA. In the old New England congregations I've served, long ago, it was easy to find out who sat in what seat, present and past. There was a seating chart! Church members paid yearly rent for their pews. Maybe you've seen them: pews with doors and/or numbers. The center seats were the most expensive; the first and last rows were free (anybody could sit there; gee, I wonder why!). If you rented a pew for the year, it was literally your family's seat (in the oldest churches, you actually owned your pew with a deed, permanently). This was one way the church raised support, along with donations of corn, firewood, etc., to the pastor. Toward the end of the 1800's, churches began to experiment with confidential giving and pledging, so you could sit anywhere, but hey, don't forget – that's my seat!

I like to imagine Jesus as a visitor. When he walks into the room, where does he sit? He is risen, so he can sit anywhere he wants, right? If he keeps visiting, he probably moves around the room, trying out different seats. At some point, he will likely sit next to you. How do you feel about that? Anything you'd like to talk about? What do you think he would ask about you, about our church?

Sometimes, when I'm thinking (maybe a little too critically!) about church traditions, I wonder, this seating habit of ours, is it really what Jesus, the head of the church, had in mind? But more than that... I remember seeing a poster – a picture of Jesus. He was sitting in a church pew much like one of ours. You know him - long brown hair, white toga-type outfit, sandals. He was leaning to one side, fast asleep, his head on the shoulder of the person next to him. That sends a particular message to me, of course.

CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE April 2024

Church Council Meeting Summary from April 9, 2024

Pastor Nichols offered a spiritual reflection based on the Jonah story. Our prayer: "When the winds blow and the waves roll, may I find myself in a community that cares enough, and is mature enough, to help me deal with my baggage. Amen."

Treasurer's Report - Currently the church has a \$2074 surplus. Report is on file. Council was in agreement to abstain from purchasing hanging baskets that are seen around Orrville streets. Council voted to sponsor OrrViews and Rotary Field of Flags. Staff reports are on file. March was a busy month with Holy Week, Confirmation activities, and Kid's Club.

Thirty baby bundles will be donated to CAMO. 3rd Sunday potlucks are planned for April (regular potluck), May (a potluck picnic with meat provided), and a special dinner on June 2nd provided by Seo Conrad.

Salvation Army and United Way are involved with Christ Church on the Bed Build Project. Lisa and the youth fellowship have also been very involved in this mission work. Council members are looking into purchasing items for CWS clean-up kits.

Council had a long discussion concerning job descriptions (not task lists) of current Christ Church personnel. Julie Finney, Terri Brest, Dwaine Hemphill, and Margaret Maupin have met with staff in their various positions. Bryan Troyer and Brian Amstutz will develop a task list for the treasurer's position.

Nancy Hranko was added to the church checking account as a signer.

Katherine Blasingame is compiling a list of committees and leaders.

Nancy Hranko has given notice that she is stepping back as bell choir director, effective May 1. Sarah Finney has offered to direct the choir.
